

In Suwon Special City in Gyeonggi-do, Republic of Korea, history and culture coexist around Suwon Hwaseong Fortress, designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site. It is also home to the world's leading global companies, including Samsung Electronics and Gwanggyo Techno Valley, and is a hub for information technology(IT), biotechnology(BT), and nanotechnology(NT).

In addition, as the largest local government in Korea with a population of 1.22 million, Suwon was designated as a special city on January 13, 2022, and has established itself as a central city with administrative and financial privileges from the central government.

Suwon is constantly striving to create a sustainable city by holding the world's first "Ecological Transportation Festival" (a car-free street for a month) with the support of international organizations, including UN-HABITAT (United Nations Human Settlement Programme) and ICLEI (Local Governments for Sustainability).
